Florida's House and Senate 2022-2023 budgets have been introduced in all the appropriations subcommittees. They will move to the full appropriations committees and

vote on it in the House and Senate Chambers. The House and the Senate then take their respective budgets and negotiate to form the final budget that will be submitted to the Governor for his approval. This negotiation process is known as the Budget conferences, and public meetings will be held to share with the public which budget line items are agreed to, changed, or eliminated. The budgets are a good indicator of where the negotiations will begin. Intellectual and developmental disabilities providers across the State of Florida, like the Key Training Center, are advocating strongly for rates increase to increase Direct Support Workers hourly rates. The Senate has offered \$15 an hour for these provider rates, and the House has come in with an offer of \$13 an hour with additional funding to get 800 individuals off the iBudget Waitlist. Advocates point out that many of those who came off the waiting list from last year are having trouble finding providers who are leaving to make more money in other jobs. The House and Senate have both offered significant funding for direct support workers. Still, the Senate's higher offer would provide a meaningful

impact on this service and encourage more people to stay in the field. We need to thank both the Senate and House for recognizing the need for a rate increase in their budget. Their budgets confirm they heard all of us. We need to continue educating the Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services on the benefits of holding their position and educating House HealthCare Appropriations Subcommittee members on the benefits of meeting the Senate's offer of \$15 an hour. Go

ahead and contact your Representative, Senator, and members of the highlighted budget committees to share your opinion. As temporary relief, the Key Center did apply for FMAP funding under the American Relief Act which gives direct care staff extra pay to recruit and retain quality employees. The funds should be distributed in March and used for up to a

Who is responsible for communicating? We all are. Good communication is part of a safe environment. Good communication is a skill you can learn.

What is communication? It helps to think about it in three parts: communication is made up of a giver, a message, and a receiver.



Stages of Communication: Giving and Receiving

Three Parts of Communication

- Giver of Information.
- Prepare the message.
- Find a suitable setting.
- > Message
- Deliver a clear message.
- · Deliver a usable message.
- Receiver of Information
- > Listen
- Actively
- · Without judgment.
- Focus on the main point.

There are three stages for GIVING information.

Get ready—What information and to whom? Is it an emergency or routine?

- ✓ Give your information—Keep it
- Check to see if it worked— Follow up.

There are also three stages for RECEIVING communication.

- ✓ **Listening**—Focus and ask questions to be sure you understand.
- Responding—repeat the information to sure that you heard it right.
- Following up—be clear about what do you need to do or need the other person to do? How soon? Does everyone agree on the plan?

KEY TRAINING CENTER TO SELL TV STATION

The Key Training Center is selling its WYKE community television station to Christian Television Network. The sale will most likely commence in March. Today's television marketplace faces historical, technological, and lifestyle challenges. It competes against new media platforms like Facebook, Twitter, Pandora, Sirius, and others which can be incredibly challenging for small market stations like WYKE. The station is licensed to Inglis and Yankeetown, two cities in Levy County—part of the Gainesville market. However, its transmitter, studios (in Lecanto), and coverage area is located in Citrus County—part of the Tampa Bay market.

A few years back, the Key Training Center decided to sell WYKE TV to focus, prioritize, and maximize the use of its resources on its core mission of providing year-round services to adults with intellectual & developmental disabilities. The Key Center has long been viewed as a leader and innovator at the Federal, State, and local level in dispensing community-based services to the developmentally disabled. The Key Center has grown to serve over 2,000 developmentally disabled citizens since its inception in 1966.

Christian Television Network (CTN) is a non-profit broadcast television network of small owned-and-operated stations that broadcast religious programming. It is based in Largo, Florida, and the flagship station is WCLF channel 22, which signed on the air in the Tampa Bay region in 1979. CTN's diversified programs are representative of a local and national interdenominational mix that features a wide variety of inspirational

programming that appeals to a broad cross-section of viewers in the communities they serve. Television programming is CTN's only business, and their stations receive 100% of their daily focus. Since 1979, CTN has produced more than 30,000 Christian programs reaching millions of homes all over the entire world. CTN will bring television operational experience and efficiency to the television license.

Since WYKE TV came on the air in 1983, the television station has enabled the Key Center to use the power of media to educate and bring public awareness to our cause, serve our community well with local news and happenings, and function as an essential asset to benefit the Key Center's array of program services. "We are very appreciative of our loyal advertisers and viewers over the years and will miss our familiar community shows to include Citrus Today," said Dennis Miller, WYKE General Manager.
